Spain 1966. John Lennon was determined to leave the Beatles to become an actor, and arrives in Almería to shoot 'How I Won the War', his first and only non-musical role. Antonio (played brilliantly

by a heartfelt Javier Cámara *I'm So Excited*, *A Gun In Each Hand*, *SFF13 Talk To Her*), is a school teacher in the small Spanish town of Albacete, who uses Beatles lyrics to teach his students English. When Antonio learns that Lennon is visiting, he decides to undertake the journey to meet his hero. On his way, Antonio meets two runaways; Juanjo (Francesc Colomer *Barcelona Summer Night SFF14*), a 16-year-old boy who is escaping his home and suffocating father, and Belén (Natalia de Molina), a 20-year-old pregnant girl reluctantly planning to go home to her mother. Together they travel in Antonio's Fiat across the stunning backdrop of Franco's sun-drenched Spain to reach a destination where they will learn more about themselves and one another than they could have imagined.

The Cannes crowd is a notoriously critical bunch to impress. So it says something that its closing night movie *Pride* prompted a standing ovation almost as long as the movie itself, eliciting whoops, cheers and tears from all and sundry.



It's the summer of 1984 - Margaret Thatcher is in power and the National Union of Mineworkers (NUM) is on strike. At the Gay Pride March in London, a group of gay and lesbian activists decides to raise money to support the families of the striking miners. But there is a problem. The Union seems embarrassed to receive their support. But the activists are not deterred. They decide to ignore the Union and go direct to the miners. They identify a mining village in deepest Wales and set off in a mini bus to make their donation in person. And so begins the extraordinary story of two seemingly alien communities who form a surprising and ultimately triumphant partnership.

Pride is about as 'British Breakout'- y as you can get, with a culture clash comedy drama tale reminiscent of the *Billy Elliot/The Full Monty* successes of the 90s.

must sell their apartment and - victims of the relentless New York City real estate market - temporarily live apart until they can find an affordable new home. While George moves in with two cops who live down stairs, Ben lands in Brooklyn with his nephew, his wife, and their temperamental teenage son, with whom Ben shares a bunk bed. While struggling with the pain of separation, Ben and George are further challenged by the intergenerational tensions and capricious family dynamics of their new living arrangements.

The film follows six brilliant scientists during the launch of the Large Hadron Collider, marking the start-up of the biggest and most expensive experiment in the history of the planet. 10,000 scientists from over 100 countries join forces in pursuit of a single goal: to recreate conditions that existed just moments after the Big Bang and find the Higgs boson, potentially explaining the origin of all matter. But our heroes confront an even bigger challenge: have we reached our limit in understanding why we exist? *Particle Fever* is a celebration of discovery, revealing the very human stories behind the tale of this epic experiment.

In order to help her, Sandra's best friend at work has convinced their boss to hold a vote - do the workers want to save Sandra's job, or keep their bonus? It is Friday and the vote will be held on Monday - Sandra has the weekend to persuade her workmates to keep her employed, or to sacrifice their bonus they need to make ends meet. Written and directed by two-time Palme d'Or-winning filmmakers, Jean-Pierre and Luc Dardenne, and with a commanding performance by Marion Cotillard, *Two Days*, *One Night* is an emotionally resonant drama.
